#### **Parents of Young Children**

- Relax! God put the wiggle in children; don't feel you have to suppress it in God's house.
- It can be helpful to sit toward the front where it is easier for children to see and hear.
- Sing hymns loudly, pray, and voice the responses with enthusiasm. Children learn behavior by copying you. If you are excited about God, they will be too!
- There are Story Bibles in the pew—your child is welcome to read, look at, and use this Bible! (If you would like to take one home, talk to Pastor Jim).
- Teach children some of the basic prayers; being able to join in with the prayers helps them feel they are contributing too. Also, it can be helpful to explain to your child what is happening during the service.
- Attend worship often, children like and need routines where they can participate. To those who are sitting near worshiping parents and children:

A smile of encouragement is always welcome to parents with small, active children! Jesus welcomed the little children, and so do we. Whether talking, crying, laughing, or singing, the sounds of children in worship are joyful songs of praise.

#### WHAT IS EPIPHANY?

Epiphany is Greek word that means "manifestation" or "appearance." It is on this day that the church celebrates that God has chosen to make himself known to the world in the person of Jesus Christ.

Epiphany is the last day of the Christmas season—the 12th day of Christmas. This year Epiphany falls on Tuesday—so we celebrate Today, the Sunday closest to the 12th day. We hear in our Gospel reading for this day of the visit of the Wise Men. This story is an example of Christ being revealed not just to Israel, but to all nations.

Throughout the season that follows, we will hear stories of Jesus being shown to be the Son of God. From the turning of water into wine to his Transfiguration, Jesus is continues to surprise his disciples and us by preaching and acting with a new authority.
