Worship with us Sunday mornings at 8:30, 9:45, or 11:00 bout 10 years ago I was given a copy of a book that, at that time, was considered ground breaking: Brian McLaren's A Generous Orthodoxy. I hated it! It didn't seem ground breaking to me at all; instead it seemed wishy washy. McLaren seemed unwilling to say what he was thinking—it was always just below the surface, but he always retreated to safe territory.

It was years before I was interested in reading more from him, and in the interim he wrote some powerful expositions on modern Christianity that have had a huge impact on me. As a church, we studied Everything Must Change about four years ago, and his book, Why Did Jesus, Moses, the Buddha, and Mohammed Cross the Road? is insightful and challenging. But it is his newest book, We Make the Road by Walking, that really struck a cord with me. The best way I can describe it is as a devotional book that is meant to be studied in a group. It is divided into 52 chapters and is intended to be read one chapter each week.

I began reading in the middle of the book, around Christmas time, and have found the material engaging and provocative. The material for Lent has really made me think. It is all based around the Sermon on the Mount found in Matthew's Gospel, and McLaren helps point out what a radical message this is. As we get closer to Easter, we need to remember that Jesus wasn't just a nice guy who was in the wrong place at the wrong time. Jesus challenged the power structures of his day—from the imperial Roman government, to the Jewish authorities, to many of the common people. Jesus turned their world upside down; and, as a result, they hung him on a tree.

Easter is a time in which we are invited to remember the radical nature of Jesus. To remember all the systems he challenged. To remember his understanding and invitation to all of us to live Kingdom values. But it is also a time to remember that whatever hardships come our way, because we choose to live within those Kingdom values, not even death is enough to slow its power.

What have you been doing this Lent to grow in God's grace? Are you taking time, finding opportunities to allow Kingdom values to take root in your life? Lent may be about over, and Easter upon us—but I invite you to pick up *We Make the Road by Walking*. We can grow together via conversation, or email, as we challenge ourselves to become more committed like the preacher from Nazareth.

# Changes to the Ridge Church Facility Use Policy are effective April 1st

The Ridge Church Operations Team at its March meeting made the following changes to the Facility Use Policy and rental fees:

- e Church members will now be charged a nominal fee of \$50 to use the facility, plus pay the site supervisor fee of \$15 per hour (when a site supervisor is required)
- Nonprofit groups will be charged \$75 to use the fellowship hall
- The following clause was added: If alcohol is found, the event will be ended immediately.
- Added a requirement that the renter representative must be present during the entire event.

# "REMEMBERING YESTERDAY FOR TOMORROW"

As we continue preparing for our 60th Anniversary, and remembering the story of Ridge Church, here is what the scriptures tell us in Joel 1:3:

Tell it to your children, and let your children tell it to their children, and their children to the next generation. Groundbreaking ceremonies for the first building were held on June 26, 1960. On November 20, 1960, the cornerstone was laid. The fellowship hall, offices, education wing and kitchen were constructed first at a cost of about \$125,000. F. G. Crary and Son, Inc. of Hammond was the builder.

The first service held in the new building was a Communion service on Friday, April 21, 1961. The first Sunday service was held on April 23, 1961. Dedication and consecration was on Sunday, September 24, 1961, with Bishop Raines
