

He, of course, is one of my favorite bishops because we're both Dukies! I have great confidence Bishop Mike will launch Ridge UMC into her next amazing 60 years with gusto! Beginning on Sunday, September 20th, you will learn more about the Season of Prayer that I am calling the entire Ridge UMC family to participate. As I have listened in cottage meetings and met many of you one on one, my heart has

heard that our Ridge family needs to spend time on our knees: praying for one another, our staff and lay leadership, as well as our community and world. I will preach a five-part sermon series on prayer while you and your small group will be asked to sign up to pray during one of our 40 days of Prayer (September 22nd through November 1st).

Finally, what a joyful celebration for our church family to dedicate our new columbarium on Sunday, September 27th at noon! Please join us because our columbarium serves as a reminder of the old church cemetery—a final resting place for the remains of loved ones on the grounds of their cherished church. By his death and resurrection Jesus overcame death, thus, death is not the end of love or the end of community.

Indeed, there is nothing dead, ending, or dying here at Ridge as we celebrate our future years together, pray with and for one another, and honor the gift of Jesus' Resurrection for all who believe!

Bishop Michael J. Coyner

"Bishop Mike," as most people call him, is originally from Anderson, Indiana. He served churches of various sizes, served as a District Superintendent, and was also the Executive Assistant to Bishop Woodie W. White. He was elected a bishop of the United Methodist Church in 1996 and was assigned to the Dakotas Area where he served two terms as resident bishop. In 2004 he was assigned to serve the Indiana Area, and in 2012 he was assigned to a third term.

Bishop Mike and his wife, Marsha, live in the Indianapolis area. He oversees the life and ministry of more than 1,100 United Methodist congregations, including more than 200,000 members organized into 10 districts.

Marsha Coyner is a special education teacher by training, and she loves music and gardening. She has often played and directed handbell choirs at various churches where Mike has served, and she has volunteered many hours of her time with UMCOR and related activities. Bishop Mike and Marsha have two adult children and five grandchildren.

More about Bishop Mike ... he received his B.A. degree from Purdue, his M. Div. degree from Duke Divinity School, and his Doctor of Ministry degree from Drew Theological School. Bishop Mike also received honorary doctorates from Dakota Wesleyan University, the University of Evansville and the University of Indianapolis. He is the author of several articles and five books: Making a Good Move (Abingdon Press, 1999), Prairie Wisdom (Abingdon Press, 2000), The Race to Reach Out (Abingdon Press, 2004), A Year With John Wesley, Our Methodist Values (Discipleship Resources, 2008) and The Andrew Paradigm: How to Be a Lead Follower of Jesus (2012 Abington Press).





Operations Team (Finance & Trustees) from the August 11th meeting:

 Treasurer Linda Boender provided financial reports for January through July 2015:

> 2015 Operating Income: \$255,057 2015 Operating Expenses: \$249,320 2015 Net Income: \$5,737

July Building Fund (mortgage) income:

\$2,599

Building Fund Expense: \$5,673(monthly mortgage payment)

- A Parsonage Fund was created for future pastoral housing needs, as per Conference requirements, with \$86,100 moved out of the Building Fund for this restricted purpose. The balance in the Building Fund to pay the monthly mortgage is \$8,787.
- Pastor Michelle is putting together a team to help run this year's pledge campaign, Extravagant Generosity, which will be presented differently than in the past.
- for a concrete walkway from the parking lot to the new columbarium, and patio in front of the columbarium, using money from the Emergency Fund. Two bids were received, with the lower bid of \$3,475 accepted. The work is expected to be completed by the September 27th Columbarium Dedication.

- Based on a lack of controls and processes for purchasing, the Team discussed creating a Purchasing Policy/Procedure for all church purchases, including reimbursements for purchases. A purchase request form is being developed, as well as guidelines for purchase approvals. This will be shared at the September 15th meeting.
- Issues with the sound in the sanctuary are being addressed, with a free consultation and evaluation done by an outside vendor. Remedies and costs will be presented in September.

Missions Team, from the August 8th meeting:

- The Team noted the generosity of the congregation during the Linens Collection for Haven House (see page 9). Sue Cook delivered the linens, plus \$175 in cash donations from members. Three \$100 gift cards for Wal-Mart were also ordered through the SCRIP program, and will be given.
- Upcoming projects include Christmas Shoeboxes in October, Angel Tree in November, and Bell Ringing for The Salvation Army in December.
- Two UMCOR projects were discussed, with the following funding approved: the AIDS Orphans Project at Maua Hospital in Kenya, \$2,000; and the Tansen United Mission Hospital in Kathmandu, Nepal, \$1,500.
